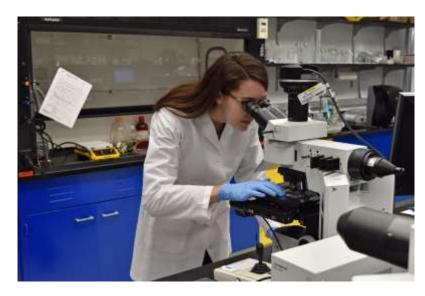

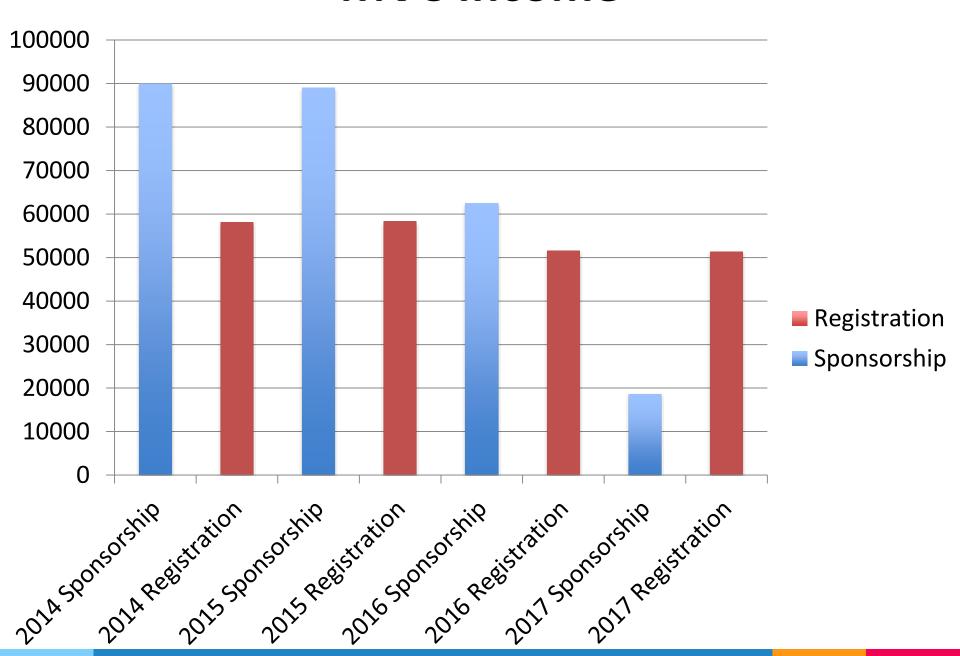

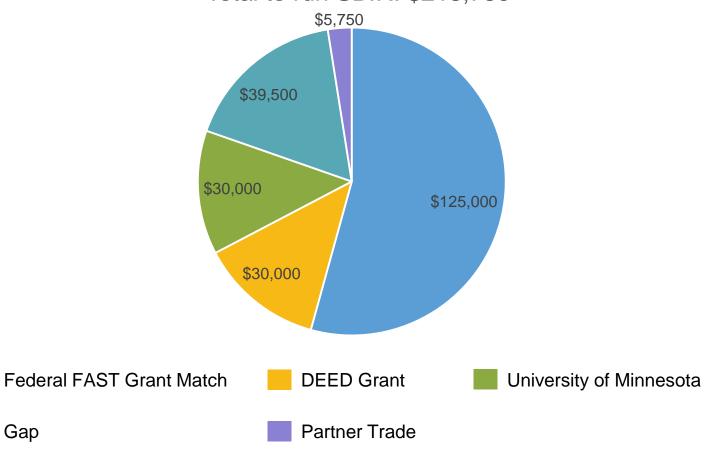

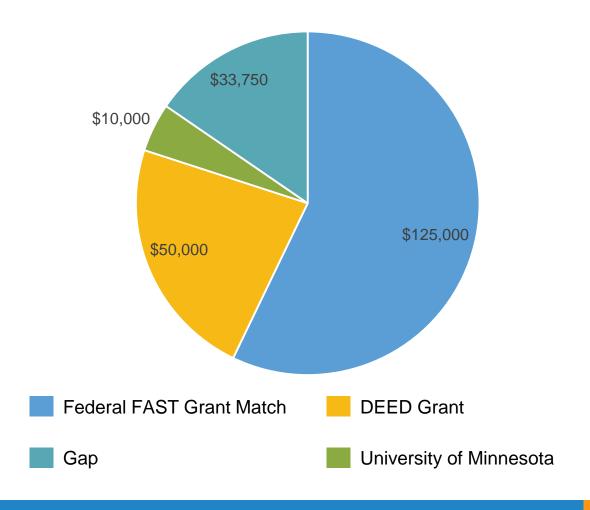


2016-2017 Program Year 1 Funding Total to run SBIR: \$218,750

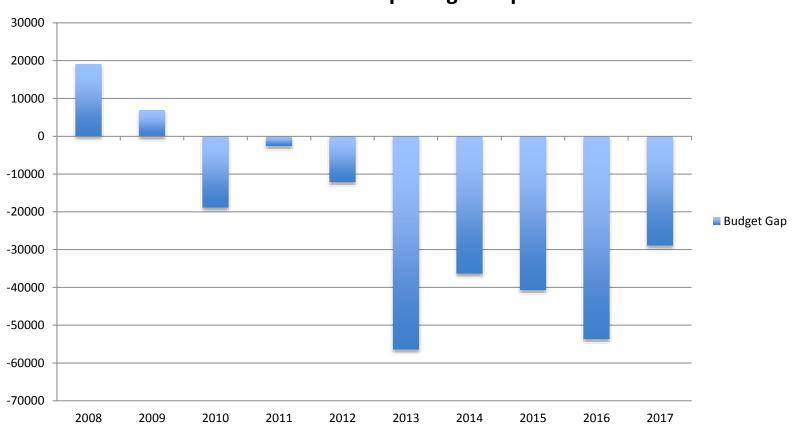

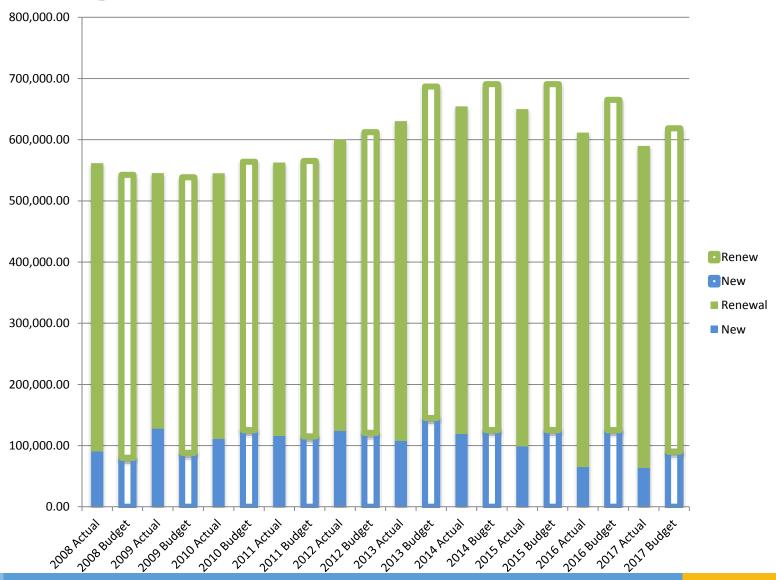
